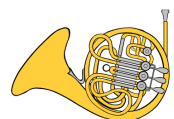

HAMILTON ASSEMBLY #2



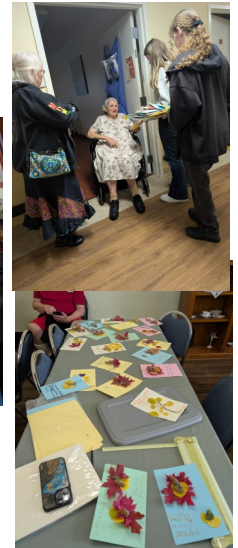
Greetings!

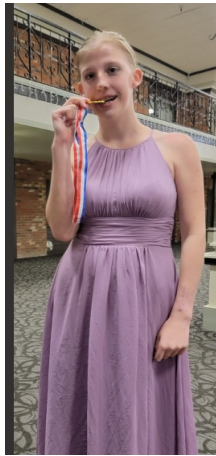
